Washington Terrace Behavior Plan

- Positive behavior interventions will continue to be the focus of our school's behavior plan. The school's behavior team has based the school plan on the research from a variety of sources.
- We will focus on empowering students by <u>teaching and showing</u> them how to manage their own stress levels. "Instead of telling students to act differently, we will take the TIME to teach them how to act differently."
- Each teacher will review the BRAVE procedure, STOP-WALK-TALK, or VOICE level in their individual classrooms on a daily basis. Specific social skills lessons and Prevention Dimension lessons will be taught weekly as the school counselor teaches in every classroom.
- **BRAVE** (acronym will be used as the school wide motto)
 - o B Behavior
 - o R Respect
 - o A Attitude
 - o V Voice
 - o E Effort

STOP - WALK - TALK (will be used in conflict resolution at the school)

- Students will use the same hand signal and word to let someone know they are bothering them.
- o Students will be taught to WALK away from the situation.
- Students will TALK about it with friends first, then talk to an adult about the situation.
- Students will earn Bulldog Tickets for good behavior. They will be able to turn in the tickets for prizes.
- Students will recognize other students <u>STANDING for BRAVE behavior</u> and the office will
 publicly acknowledge the peer nominations. There will be a recognition box in the foyer of
 the school for students to drop their peer nominations.

VOICE – Students will understand the appropriate <u>VOICE</u> for each situation

Zero Voice -Silence is golden Spy Talk -Only one person can hear you Low flow - Small Group - only the group can hear you Formal Normal -Normal conversation voice Loud Crowd-Presenting voice - everyone can hear you Outside voice -Playground voice - OUTSIDE ONLY
